Racism and "Colorblindness"

The following is an excerpt from "Detour-Spotting for White Anti-racists" by Jona Olsson. It was first published in *Rain and Thunder*, Spring 2009, and we reprint it here, with Jona's permission, as part of our racism-awareness series. We invite more articles on this issue from OLOC members.

"Colorblindness" negates the cultural values, norms, expectations and life experiences of people of color. Even if an individual white person could ignore a person's color, the society does not. By saying we don't see their color, we are also saying we don't see our whiteness. This denies their experience of racism and our experience of privilege... We have heard folks say "I'm not racist because...I have Vietnamese friends or my lover is Black. I donate to Casa Latina, or I marched with Dr. King." This detour into denial wrongly equates personal interrelations with people of color, no matter how intimate they may be, with anti-racism. It assumes our personal associations free us magically from our racist conditioning. Someone may say, "I want to stop acting like a racist, so please tell me when I do something you think is racist." White people often assume we can learn about racism only from people of color. We further assume that people of color have the energy and/or desire to do this teaching. My understanding is that most people of color are weary of educating white people about racism. We should seek out other white people before we go to people of color. We can't assume people of color should be so grateful for our attempts at anti-racism that they will be willing to guide us whenever we are ready to be guided.

Report from The Old Lesbian Oral Herstory Project, 2013

Yet another year for the OLOHP was filled with milestones, learning experiences, and challenges. We're ending the year with just over 325 herstories in various stages of completion. Unlike the previous two years, we didn't conduct as many interviews in 2013. We felt it was important to take time out to put together an event that celebrated the myriad contributions and accomplishments of the women who have shared their stories. The event, *Celebrating Our Lesbian Legacies*, was held in October 2013 in Houston and was an incredible experience for everyone involved.

We're pleased to say that in 2013 we had interviews conducted by ten different women. We're also thrilled that we had several women contribute by volunteering their time and talents to transcribe for us.

We continue to work with Smith College on the processing and accessioning of stories from the OLOHP collection and anticipate transferring an additional 50+ herstories to them in 2014.

The OLOHP Insider, our quarterly newsletter, continues to help our readers gain a better understanding of the Project, the women in the collection, and their place in history.

A new focus for the OLOHP is to explore various methods for sharing the herstories with a larger audience. In June, the group did a dramatic reading of excerpts taken from the herstories at an event in Seattle. Representatives of the OLOHP also did an extensive presentation about the Project to GLEAM, the LGBT workplace group of Microsoft.

Memorials

Billie Potts, 1940-2014

OLOC member Billie Potts, of Seneca Falls and Summit, NY, succumbed to heart failure in early December, which came as a shock to her long-time partner Sharon Kuromiya, her daughter, and a wide community of devoted friends and colleagues.



Billie taught workshops at the 2008 and 2010 OLOC Gatherings and once consulted with OLOC about fundraising.

Billie was a nationally known women's spirituality pioneer, an artist, herbalist, and educator. Her many publications include A New Women's Tarot, Small Scaled Goat-keeping, Witches Heal: Lesbian Herbal Self-Sufficiency, and Uncounted Daughters: Jewish Women Healers in the West.

She was a potter and ceramic sculptor, a dairy goat farmer and organic grower and coordinated alternative healing facilities for major women's music festivals. She also facilitated herbal healing and tarot workshops across the US since 1976.

Kathy Glass, 1932-2014

After a long illness, OLOC member Kathy Glass died January 14 in Denver, CO. She and Carmah Lawler, her wife and partner of 36 years,

received the first Del Martin Old Lesbian Pride Award in 2010.

Kathy and Carmah were active in local and state politics for many years on behalf of numerous LGBT issues and raised thousands of dollars to help elect candidates supportive of Lesbian and gay rights. They were recognized for their work on behalf of Jefferson County Democrats when the GLBT Democratic Caucus selected them Democrats of the Year. They were also honored to receive the prestigious Eleanor Roosevelt Award.

A Memorial Service was held on February 15, 2014, at the Lakewood Country Club in Lakewood, CO.

Rita Vander Weyden, 1927-2013

Rita, a member of OLOC since the early 1990s, died in November 2013. She lived in Louisiana.

Why Old?

We call ourselves **Old** Lesbians Organizing for Change, not older Lesbians. The reason we claim the word Old is to cut through the usual euphemistic terms adopted to hide aging which, consequently, reinforce an ageist attitude. Terms like senior, mature, older (than what?) prime timer, etc., objectify the old person.

There is also a movement sense of affirming being old, just as the slogan "Black is Beautiful" signified a change from a negative to a positive attitude toward being Black. Similarly, gay people have embraced the word Queer.

The term elder but not elderly seems popular today because of its cultural authenticity. Though I do have some question about its authenticity in non-tribal society.
