COME TO OUR ANNUAL PICNIC!!

Sunday, July 23, 12:00 – 4:00 Live Oak Park, Berkeley

On July 23rd, Bay Area OLOC will be picnicking at Live Oak Park in Berkeley, Picnic Area 2, 12:00-4:00. We invite all lesbians 60 and over—plus partners and caregivers of any age—to this annual event. It is a great way to meet new friends and connect with women you haven't seen for a while. We've resumed picnics after the worst of the pandemic, and those attending have raved about getting hugs and seeing actual live Old Lesbians in the flesh!

Most of us have been vaccinated and boosted and many have had Covid. If you have immunity, you're welcome to wear a mask or not. We ask that you wear a mask if you have not been vaccinated or recovered from Covid. Some women can't get vaccinated for health reasons or are immune compromised, so we don't make assumptions about mask wearers.

We rely on those attending to either bring food to share or bring food of your own. There will not be grilling in the picnic area due to some of us being sensitive to smoke. OLOC will supply paper plates, cups, and utensils. Our experience is that there are always vegetarian and gluten-free contributions among the pot-luck dishes.

The site has water and ample seating. Disabled women are allowed to use the accessible indoor restroom at the Berkeley Art Center right by our area. Able-bodied women are asked to use the park's public restroom across the street. The wooded, shady site is accessible to wheelchairs and scooters and is served by paratransit. Parking is on the street and the SF Mime Troupe is also performing in the park that day, so carpool and/or arrive early! For a ride from North Berkeley BART or to participate in a carpool, call Ginny Garrett ahead of time at 510 495-4285. **Our site is Picnic Area 2, between Oxford and Walnut** at the Berkeley Art Center, 1275 Walnut Street.

"Love, Laughter & Resilience" November 15 – 19, 2023 in Tempe, Arizona

National OLOC, of which Bay Area OLOC is a chapter, is holding its international Gathering this year in Tempe, near Phoenix, Arizona. Gatherings are the most exciting, ambitious events that OLOC sponsors. National and local financial support is available so every Old Lesbian (55 and over) who wants to attend is welcome to participate.

The Gathering will feature:

- Lesbians of Color Day on 11/15, facilitated by Dr. Maria Luisa "Papusa" Molina;
- A concurrent day for White Lesbians to examine unconscious racism on 11/15;
- Presentation of the Del Martin-Phyllis Lyon Old Lesbian Pride Award to Linda
 Wilson, Production & Stage Manager, National Women's Music Festival since 1987;
- Keynote Friday evening speaker Bettina Aptheker on 11/17;
- A Laugh Fest with comic Karen Williams on Saturday 11/18; and
- A full program including workshops, films, caucuses, the memorial slide show, a Gathering choir practice & performance, and dancing!

Early registration for the Gathering ends on August 1st, with fees increasing after that. Financial assistance to help pay for travel and hotel is available from National OLOC. Bay Area OLOC's first retreat since 2019 was a huge success! (But we have had to cancel the retreat that was planned for this fall...)

Bay Area OLOC held our first retreat since fall of 2019 from Friday May 19 through Sunday, May 21. It was attended by about 45 women, many of whom were participating in an OLOC event for the first time. For old timers, it marked a return to a Bay Area OLOC tradition stretching back a long way. Until the pandemic, spring and fall retreats were welcome gettogethers for many years.

Women at the retreat were enthusiastic about the chance to socialize, meeting new and old friends. The Saturday evening Salon, emceed by Molly Martin, showcased poetry, visual art, music, prose, and an original skit. Following the Salon, a bunch of women played cards and dominos. The facility provided a female lifeguard for many lesbians to skinny dip and play ball in the water. The bath house has been completely rebuilt and a shuttle carried women to the pool down the steep drive. The food was plentiful with vegetarian and gluten-free options at every meal.

Our location, Enchanted Hills Camp, has been undergoing extensive renovation and rebuilding since fires devastated the Napa region and their operations had also been interrupted by the pandemic. Plans are underway for more construction and that is the reason that our plans to return in fall 2023 have had to be cancelled. Enchanted Hills serves blind children and adults over the summer, so the important project of "undergrounding" their electrical lines to protect them from wind and fire means that the camp will be closed in the fall. Bay Area OLOC has reserved weekends in spring, and fall, 2024 for our retreats.

National OLOC offers a variety of Zoom programs and support groups – Join now to stay up-to-date!

The national OLOC website offers a wealth of resources and material of interest to Old Lesbians. There are recordings and links to Zoom programs going back to 2020, and links to support meetings for such groups as widows, caregivers, and Lesbians who are fluent in American Sign Language among others. A series of presentations on ending White dominance has had a number of sessions and is ongoing.

If you sign up with national OLOC, you will receive notices of up-coming Zoom events. The email notices are the only way to register and get access to online events, and these events are restricted to Lesbians. Everyone is asked <u>not</u> to post notices of OLOC Zoom events on social media so the events stay safer. There is a downloadable form for joining, and a link to join online. You decide how much you are willing and able to pay for joining – if money is an issue you can join for free. If you are not signed up yet, do it now!

National OLOC has recently adopted the term "affiliate" for women who join the organization. In the national OLOC world, "affiliate" equals "member." Locally, Bay Area OLOC refers to everyone on our mailing list as "members" but you won't receive notices of national events unless you sign up at www.oloc.org
